

# MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY

## REGULATIONS FOR OUT-OF-STATE & INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

---

The following descriptions outline the terms that must be satisfied to maintain each award

### **UNIVERSITY SCHOLARS AWARD**

---

The recipient must enroll at MSU for the semester for which the scholarship is awarded; the award may not be deferred to a subsequent semester of initial enrollment. This award is limited to eight consecutive semesters of enrollment (fall and spring of an academic year) as an undergraduate. MSU reserves the right to alter this award in the presence of other MSU scholarship offers. This award is contingent upon the student maintaining out-of-state residency. The recipient must enroll for and complete a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester. If circumstances prevent a student from enrolling and completing the minimum credit load or it is necessary to drop credits below the minimum credit load, prior approval must be received from the Assistant Director of Admissions. The recipient is expected to maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. The academic record will be reviewed at the end of the first two semesters of enrollment and thereafter each semester. A scholar who does not meet the minimum criterion will be placed on probation for two semesters. Failure to meet minimum GPA requirements upon the completion of the terms of probation will result in cancellation of the scholarship until the cumulative 3.0 GPA is reestablished. Semesters for which the recipient is not eligible to receive this scholarship are forfeited. The recipient must notify the Assistant Director of Admissions in writing if enrollment at MSU is disrupted (excluding summer semester) and request an official leave of absence from the University.

### **PRESIDENTIAL STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP**

---

The recipient must enroll at MSU for the semester for which the scholarship is awarded; the award may not be deferred to a subsequent semester of initial enrollment. This award may only be used for MSU-sponsored study abroad programs or programs co-sponsored by MSU's Office of Study Abroad and another accredited institution. This award must be used within the first eight semesters of enrollment as an undergraduate at MSU, or before completion of the undergraduate degree (whichever time period is shorter). Students wishing to utilize this award must communicate their scholarship status to their MSU Study Abroad Program Coordinator at the time of application for the program. This award is contingent upon the student maintaining out-of-state residency. The recipient must be in good academic standing with the University for the award to disburse.

### **GLOBAL SPARTAN SCHOLARSHIP**

---

The recipient must enroll at MSU for the semester for which the scholarship is awarded. This award may only be used at Michigan State University and is limited to two semesters of enrollment as an undergraduate international student. The value of the award is \$1,000 and will be divided into equal installments between the fall and spring semesters of the student's first academic year. The recipient must maintain international out-of-state residency and enroll for a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester in order for the award to disburse.

### **LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP**

---

The recipient must enroll at MSU for the semester for which the scholarship is awarded; the award may not be deferred to a subsequent semester of initial enrollment. This award is limited to eight consecutive semesters of enrollment (fall and spring of an academic year) as an undergraduate. MSU reserves the right to alter this award in the presence of other MSU scholarship offers. This award is contingent upon the student maintaining out-of-state residency. The recipient must enroll for and complete a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester. If circumstances prevent a student from enrolling and completing the minimum credit load or it is necessary to drop credits below the minimum credit load, prior approval must be received from the Assistant Director of Admissions. The recipient is expected to maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. The academic record will be reviewed at the end of the first two semesters of enrollment and thereafter each semester. A scholar who does not meet the minimum criterion will be placed on probation for two semesters. Failure to meet minimum GPA requirements upon the completion of the terms of probation will result in cancellation of the scholarship until the cumulative 3.0 GPA is reestablished. Semesters for which the recipient is not eligible to receive this scholarship are forfeited. The recipient must notify the Assistant Director of Admissions in writing if enrollment at MSU is disrupted (excluding summer semester) and request an official leave of absence from the University.

### **GLOBAL NEIGHBORS SCHOLARSHIP**

---

The recipient must enroll at MSU for the semester for which the scholarship is awarded. This award may only be used at Michigan State University and is limited to eight consecutive semesters of enrollment as an undergraduate. The value of the award is for two semesters (fall and spring) during the academic year. The Global Neighbors Scholarship of \$4,000 per year for up to eight semesters of enrollment is not based on need. It will, however, be considered part of a financial aid award. Michigan State reserves the right to alter this award in the presence of other MSU scholarship offers. This award is contingent upon the student maintaining international out-of-state residency. A student must enroll for and complete a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester. If circumstances prevent a student from enrolling for the minimum credit load, or it is necessary to drop credits below the minimum credit load, prior approval must be received from the Assistant Director of Admissions. This award will be credited to the student's account each fall and spring semester at registration. The recipient is expected to maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. The academic records of all scholars will be reviewed at the end of the first two semesters of enrollment and thereafter each semester. Scholars who do not meet the minimum criteria will be placed on probation for two semesters. Failure to meet the minimum GPA requirements upon completion of the terms of probation will result in cancellation of the scholarship until the cumulative 2.5 GPA is reestablished. Semesters for which the recipient is not eligible to receive this scholarship are forfeited. A student must notify the Assistant Director of Admissions in writing if enrollment at MSU is disrupted (excluding summer semester) and request an official leave of absence from the University.
